PBIS Committee Meetings: The PBIS Tier 1 school wide team held a meeting on January 27th, to review data and information regarding student referrals and action planning from the school year. The committee continues to review and provide feedback on grade level data analysis regarding student behaviors.

PBIS Tier 2 school wide team met on January 12th, to review and discuss the goals for the year regarding the “Check-in and Check-out program” The PBIS coordinator and coaches distributed the paper work to begin the initial start-up of identifying one to three students at each building level for the program.

PBIS weekly Strive for Five Programs: Coaches continue to provided weekly strive for five informational resources to teachers on a weekly basis. The information is used as a guide for staff members to work on with their perspective students. We are working to upgrade classrooms with posters and materials for the teachers and students.

PBIS referrals:

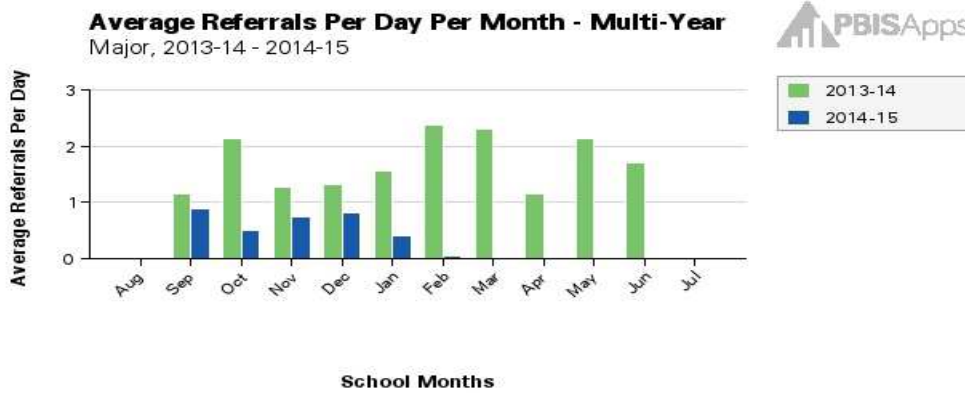
The numbers at the high school have been consistent with last year with a net gain of 19 total office managed referrals. The middle school has dropped in referrals from this time last year with a reduction of 79 referrals & the elementary has a net gain of 22 referrals.

Notation: If we see an increase in referrals from one year to another it’s not necessary a problem. The PBIS program encourages our staff to build on relationships with our students and parents in support of good communication throughout the process. A referral form is a process to encourage the necessary feedback provided to the students and parents to correct or teach proper behaviors in the school building. However, overtime, the goal for everyone is to see a decrease in major referrals.

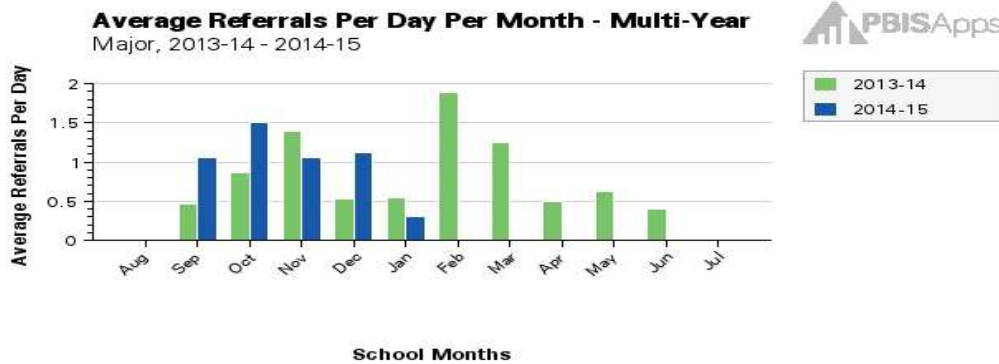
High School total Major referrals – 2013-2014 (163) vs. 2014-2015 (182) Increase of 19 referrals.
