The position of the school nurse is very important in the Bayfield School District. I would like to outline some of her accomplishments for the 2011-2012 school year.

- Provided staff training
- Provided 1st Aide kits for teachers
- Coordinated CPR classes for staff
- Coordinated with Red Cliff Clinic, Bayfield County Health, MMC, CDC, and State Epidemiologists
- Provided fluoride rinse for K-5 throughout the year
- Coordinated with The Lakes for 5th grade dental education
- Made several home visits to discuss health issues with parents
- Mentored WITC nursing students to provide hands on experiences
- Coordinated with Red Cliff Clinic to have public health nurses available for students on a weekly basis
- Had contact with approximately 45 students per day, (besides those needing medication administration)
- Medication pick up, administration, and maintenance of paperwork between parents and doctors
- Completed School Based Service billings
- Made numerous parent contacts to coordinate student/doctor appointments, providing health information, and giving support
- Provided countless hugs to students and staff

I have participated in training for RtI (Response to Intervention) PLC (Professional Learning Community), Safe and Supportive Schools, and Neurobiology of Addiction.

We have two students receiving ESY (Extended School Year) services. There have been some changes in the staff who have been working with one child, but we have been able to make sure there is coverage.

This school year we will be doing the self-assessment for the Special Education Program. We have started making initial progress on that project.
