Bayfield Troller After School Program (TAP):

The Bayfield Troller After School Program began on October 12, 2009. Activities are held on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 3:30 – 5 p.m. **Eighty** students attended Session I.

Session II November 30, 2009 – January 14, 2010 is currently in running. **Fifty-seven** students are enrolled.

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The **LaPointe After School Program** began in October. Activities are held on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. LaPointe Elementary had an average daily attendance of 10 students during session I.

Wellness and Nutrition

- Food Service Staff continues to work hard providing **fresh fruits and vegetables** to our K-5 students.
- More students are eating Breakfast. The next Parent Breakfast will be on January 15, 2010.
- Recess – Classrooms are charting their daily activity. Students are encouraged to engage in 60 minutes of activity per day. Some days the students have had as many as 90 minutes of activity. On average, classes have 60 minutes of physical activity per day.

School Climate and Behavior

- K-5 Teachers have been working hard to teach positive behaviors and procedures in their classrooms. Students are responding well. Students are adjusting to new routines and schedules. Natural Looping occurred for several of our staff and students. Students are off to a positive productive start.
- Elementary Winter Reading Celebration January 19, 2010.
- Elementary Awards Ceremony January 22, 2010.
- **559** Behavior Bucks were earned and spent at the December 17 & 18 Polar Express Shop. On average each student earned 4 behavior bucks.
- Elementary Special Education Classrooms have been restructured to meet the needs of our students.
- Twenty- Four Out of School Suspensions have been issued for Student Office Managed Behavior Referrals. Circles and Alternative Behavior Consequences have been effectively used with students.
- Staff and Parents are working hard to develop plans that best meet the needs of the students. Students are taught positive behaviors and expectations.

Parent Advisory Council

What are the responsibilities of the Parent Advisory Council?

The Parent Advisory Council has many responsibilities, including:

- Working collaboratively as part of the School Community to develop and conduct parent trainings that focus on parent advocacy skills and partnering with the school to help children succeed.
- Communicating with and getting feedback from other parents in the community.
- Examining various multimedia products and services developed by the school system to communicate with parents, and providing feedback on quality and clarity.
- Providing advice on innovative ways to communicate with parents about system wide initiatives, programs, and activities.
- Providing feedback as requested to the Elementary Principal.

What is the structure of the Parent Advisory Council?

The PAC is composed of 12 to 24 parents who serve two-year terms. (One representative and alternate from each class) For the purposes of this Council, the

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term "parent" refers to the parent or legal guardian of a child enrolled in Bayfield Elementary.

How are members chosen to serve on the Parent Advisory Council? Parents will be invited to participate.

When will the Parent Advisory Council meetings be held?

PAC will meet six times during the 2009–2010 school year. The meetings will last approximately 60 minutes, beginning at 6:00 p.m., on the following dates:

- Wednesday, February 17, 2010
- Wednesday, March 17, 2010
- Wednesday, April 21, 2010
- Wednesday, May 19, 2010

What will be expected of PAC members?

Each member will serve a two-year term. Members may not serve for more than two consecutive terms. PAC representatives will agree to have personal contact information posted on the website to allow area stakeholders to communicate and provide input. Council members will be expected to attend all scheduled meetings; prepare for each meeting as needed; work in a collaborative fashion with each other and with school system staff; express views and opinions openly, constructively, and respectfully; and help facilitate parent advocacy trainings. Although staff will develop an agenda for each meeting, Council representatives may submit discussion items for consideration.

Watch D.O.G.S.

Dads of Great Students is an innovative program focusing on safety and education in schools by using the positive influence of fathers and father-figures for a two-fold purpose: (1) to provide an unobtrusive fathering presence and (2) to provide a positive and active role-model for students at the school. Fathers, stepfather, grandfathers and uncles are asked to spend at least one day at their student's school volunteering. They will support the school through monitoring the school property, working one-on-one or in small groups, reading, using flashcards, helping with homework, being referees for playground sports, using listening ears, or for whatever needs to be done to plant seeds of success in the lives of our students.

The Watch D.O.G.S. (Dads of Great Students) Program has been recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and The U. S. Department of Health and Human Services. The founders have been involved with the U.S. Department of Education's Partnership for Family Involvement in Education.
