Achievement & Curriculum Expansion

Elementary Staff Committees:

- ***Elementary PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies) Team.*** The PBIS Team of seven elementary staff (Angela Botka, Lonnie Cameron, Sheila Everhart, Karen Grieve, Lois Hulse, Janine Johanik and Trent Hanson) met June 2, 2011 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 220. Staff has developed a K-12 PBIS Student Behavioral Data Collection Form. This K-12 document will be a tool used beginning September 1, 2011 to assist in data collection for Staff to record staff managed behaviors and for the Principal to record Office Managed Behaviors. All data will be recorded on the on the School-Wide Information System (SWIS). Data will be used to evaluate and re-teach social skills curriculum (conflict resolution, anger management, peer relationships and bullying prevention). Data will also be used to identify staff training needs: (appropriate playground supervision strategies; scan, move, interact, etc.) And the data will be use to identify students' needs. The PBIS Team needs to attend additional training. School wide interventions need to be taught to students regarding the common areas: cafeteria, hallways, playground and the school bus. The team needs to develop lesson plans for this instruction (PBIS) "Cool Tools". The team will also train staff with the Peaceful Playground and Peaceful School Bus Curriculum in August during the staff in-service days.
- ***Elementary RTI (Response to Instruction) Team.*** The RTI team of eight elementary staff (Angela Botka, Deb Boulley, Sheila Everhart, Melissa Giesregen, Karen Grieve, Vicki Redenbaugh, Anne Sullivan, and Sandy Raspotnik met June 9, 2011 at 3:30 p.m. Maija Alexandrou CESA 12 /Wisconsin State Wide RTI consultant spoke with K-5 staff on Tuesday June 7, 2011 at 3:30 p.m. Maija highlighted the Wisconsin and Federal RTI guidelines needed to ensure that appropriate, well-implemented, researched-based best practices are consistently used in each classroom and that proactive identification and interventions are in place for struggling students before learning problems become ingrained. Maija also share the information regarding the RTI Leadership Team Intervention Convention August 8-11, 2011 to be held at the Gitche Gumeew Academy in Ashland. Up to 18 K-5 staff can attend this training to review interventions and learn how to determine reliability, validity and feasibility of the intervention strategies. Staff will also begin the process of creating Curriculum Based Measures (CMB) to evaluate students' academic achievement over time.
- ***Elementary Reading Instruction and Delivery of Services Team*** The Reading Team of nine staff (Angela Botka, Deb Boulley, Joe Groshek, Elizabeth Hurrell, Betty Juedes, Allison Nyara, Carol Kouba, Laura Bohn and Sheila Everhart) met on May 31, 2011 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 214. The District Annual Title Meeting was held on June 1, 2011. Data shared at this meeting identified a need for title services and support at the Middle School and High School Levels. To meet this need at the MS/HS there will a change in Title staffing assignments for the 2011-2012 school year. Mrs. Deb Boulley will implement the Intermediate Daily 5

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Fostering Independent Literacy Learning in 6th grade. She will also implement the Intermediate Café in the classroom; Helping Readers Thrive in 6th grade using Reading/ Writing workshops structure (best practices). Sixth Grade students will be scheduled for 90 minute uninterrupted Reading/Language Arts block per day. All 6th grade students will receive whole group reading and writing lessons, and small group guided reading instruction in the classroom environment. Our Title Meeting also identified a need for all students and parents to complete a Learning Plan (Compact). The Learning Plan should include academic, personal and social goals for improved student achieve. Elementary Title/Reading Resource Teacher Angela Botka will be helping the school develop a Learning Plan so that we are in compliance with our Title Grant obligations. Each Student and Parent will be asked to complete the Learning Plan on September 1, 2011. All learning plans will be in pace during the first week of school. Learning plans will be reviewed by Classroom Teachers no later that the sixth week on the school year to gauge student academic progress. Students' Academic process or lack of academic growth will be reported to the RTI Team to ensure support or acceleration for students.

- **2200 Summer Reading Program Books** were distributed to K-5 students on June 8 and June 9, 2011. Each student was able to choose 10 books at reading and interest level. Students will be asked to maintain a reading log over the summer. Participating student will be invited to a reading celebration September 2011.
- **Elementary Digital Textbooks and Technology Team** The Textbook/Technology team of seven staff (Carol Sowl, Shellie Swanson, Karen DePerry, Kathy Noteboom, Tammy Curran-Weber, June Bavluka and Sheila Everhart) met on June 8, 2011 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 216. Staff is eager to meet our new Technology Director, Chris Plansky. Chris will assume his duties in the District on July 5, 2011. Staff will continue to investigate the use of e-readers and Ipods as instructional tools. Staff will also analyze the use of workbooks and consumables for instruction. (Blackline masters worksheets vs. hands-on learning).
- **Bayfield Elementary School Improvement Planning (SIP) team** of six staff (Angela Botka, Janine Johanik, Melissa Giesregen, Karen DePerry, Anne Sullivan and Sheila Everhart) met on June 6, 2011 to discuss the draft of the School Improvement Plan. The team has asked for a meeting with second grade classroom teachers, title/reading resource teachers and special education teachers to discuss providing all students with universal reading instruction and tier II instruction in the classroom during the 90 minute block of instructional time. The meeting is scheduled for June 10, 2011 at 1:30 p.m. in room 214.

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2011-2012 Kindergarten Enrollment Update:

As of June 7, 2011; there are 24 students who are eligible to attend Kindergarten September 1, 2011. Students will be divided into two classrooms with 12-12 students. LaPointe will not have students enrolled in Kindergarten September 2011.

2011-2012 First Grade Projected Enrollment Update: As of June 7, 2011; there are 36 students enrolled for 1st grade. Students will be divided into two classrooms with 18-18 students. The school has been notified that a Coast Guard Family will be moving here with a First Grade Student. When the new student enrolls class sizes will be 18 – 19 students for a total 37 students. The Elementary Principal is considering several scenarios to ensure academic success is obtained by all students.

2011-2012 LaPointe Elementary Projected Enrollment As of June 7, 2011; there will be 11 students enrolled at LaPointe Elementary. LaPointe Elementary will have one multi-grade classroom teacher; Carol Sowl. Sheri Milburn will be reassigned to Bayfield Elementary to teach 4th grade. Ms. Milburn is to be commended for her years of service at LaPointe Elementary.

Bayfield Troller After School Program (TAP):

The Bayfield Troller After School Program Session IV ended on May 13, 2011. Student activities are held at school, the recreation center, Red Cliff Recreational Hall, and the Red Cliff Prevention Center. The Grant Team is collected participation data. Summer Enrichment Courses will begin on Monday June 13, 2011. Mr. Trent Hanson is the TAP Lead Teacher and Family Night Coordinator will also be involved with our TAP Summer program.

New in August, 2011: K-5 Reading/Writing Workshops. The purpose of this 12-day summer learning opportunity is to strengthen and support the literacy skills and strategies students apply to their reading and writing work. Reading instruction will focus on strategies students use to read fluently and comprehend text. Writing instruction will focus on generating and organizing ideas in narrative and expository texts. Teachers will read aloud to students daily to model effective comprehension work and to analyze the craft of writing. Students will work on vocabulary development through word study and word play activities. As of June 7, 2011 20 students have signed up to participate in the Reading/Writing Workshops.

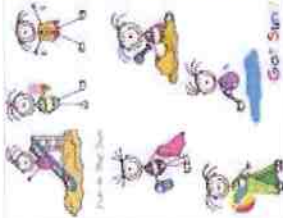
