This year we held 190 IEP and 504 meetings. Of those 190 meetings, 175 were for Native American Students.

We will be having a data retreat to examine and analyze the Online Youth Risk Behavior Survey that was completed by the High School students this spring. Jim Lee from CESA 12 will be coming on June 13th to work with the Safe and Supportive School Committee. The committee will be attending the Safe and Supportive School (S3) Summer Institute in Madison on June 18-20. We will be working on our plan for next year based on the data from the survey.

We have completed our Disproportionality report and have submitted it to the state.

The RtI committee met with Amanda Popovich and has laid out plans for Professional Development for the 2012-2013 school year. We will be looking at continued curricular work on English Language Arts and Math. We will be researching and studying

instructional models and beginning to look at Assessment. There will also be times scheduled which allow for teachers to examine test data on students that has been gathered with the STAR Enterprise program.

This is a busy time of year as we close out one year and look toward the planning of next year. I am excited about the changes and progress we have made this year. Our PBIS program is growing, we have started Universal screenings which is part of the RtI model, we have provided some interesting programming with the S3 grant. Next year is an important year and I hope that we can continue to move forward as we have another transition year.
