**Achievement & Curriculum Expansion**

**2012-2013 Student Enrollment Projections:** Below are current enrollments. Our hope is to have more students enroll throughout the summer. At this point four students will be joining us through open enrollment. The numbers below are reflective of the additions.

\*Elementary Staff have been meeting to discuss options as to how to maintain class sizes of 18 and under with a reduction 1 classroom teacher (14.0 FTE to 13.0 FTE). Our current first grade class has an enrollment of 41 students. Student Achievement Guarantee in Education (SAGE) program under the guidance of DPI provides supplement entitlements based on the number students who qualify for free or reduced lunch. This money is provided to districts to supplement the Fund 10 expenses of salary and benefits to maintain small class. In order to be eligible all class sizes must be 18 or fewer. Staff has been researching best practices: multiage classrooms vs. split classrooms. Staff is planning to visit schools that have multi-age classrooms. Staff will continue to meet on a weekly basis. It is our hope to have a decision made by April 25, 2012. It is also our hope that students will be notified of their 2012-2013 Teacher prior to June 30, 2012.

**Spring Pilot – Picture Day Opportunity March 29, 2012**

Lifetouch has updated their photo options for parents by offering enhancements via the internet. Lifetouch had been offering these options statewide for the last two years. We

**Elementary Staff Committees:**

➤ ***Elementary PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies) Team.***

The PBIS Team will meet on March 27, 2012. Between September 1, 2011 and March, 2012 there were a total of:

- 212 student behavior referrals were processed on SWIS (School Wide Information System);
  - 115 minor staff managed student behavior referrals
    - 56 referrals were generated for 12 students with IEPs
    - 59 referrals were generated for regular education students
  - 97 office managed student behavior referrals
    - 60 referrals were generated for 13 students with IEPs
    - 37 referrals were generated for 20 regular education students

As we continue to work on PBIS and our efforts to STRIVE for Five: Respect, Responsibility, Cooperation, Honesty and Kindness: Staff was asked to review with students; Behavior Expectations and Procedures – “How we do things;” (Hallway Behavior, Bathroom Behavior, Playground Behavior, Bus Behavior, Cafeteria Behavior, and Classroom Behaviors). The School “Caught is the Act” slip has been revised to incorporate the Bayfield PBIS Strive for Five Logo.

We continue to work on Team Implementation Checklist (TIC) and Self-Assessment Survey (SIR). Members of the PBIS team are Angela Botka, Lonnie Cameron, Sheila Everhart, Karen Grieve, Lois Hulse, Janine Johanik and Trent Hanson. It is with great pleasure the Elementary PBIS team present this PBIS Strive for Five Montages to the school district in recognition of our students and staff.

➤ ***Elementary RTI (Response to Instruction) Team.***

The team is working collaboratively to continue to develop the implementation of the RTI Framework.

The K-12 RTI team has been meeting weekly to determine a Universal Assessments schedule and the next steps in the RTI framework implementation development.

The next K-5 RTI meeting is scheduled for March 28, 2012 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 106. On this date the time will review data to ensure students' academic needs are being met. K-5 teachers will be given collaboration time May 1-10, 20102 to: obtain assessment data, review and compare prior data, review instructional

strategies for Reading, Language Arts and Mathematics and document students' progress. Staff will review progress monitoring plans for students who did not meet benchmark assessments. Staff will continue the process of using Universal Screening Tools (AIMS Web) and Common Progress Monitoring Tools (STAR Reading/STAR Math and AIMS Web/ Fountas and Pinnell Benchmarks) to evaluate students' academic achievement over time. ➤ ***Elementary Reading Instruction and Delivery of Services Team***

Friday, March 2, 2012 was Dr. Seuss' Birthday, as well as National Read Across America Day. This was the kick-off day for our "March Madness" Reading Competition. Students are working as teams: Kindergarten and 1st Grade, 2nd and 3rd Grade, and 4th and 5th Grade. Reading totals are tallied daily. A running total of hours read is posted for all students to see on the hallway bulletin boards. Members of the Reading Instruction Team are Angela Botka, Deb Boulley, Elizabeth Hurrell, Betty Juedes, Allison Nyara, Carol Kouba, Laura Bohn, Tammy Weber, Trent Hanson and Sheila Everhart.

➤ ***Elementary Digital Textbooks and Technology Team***

The Textbook/Technology team will meet March 21, 2012. Elementary Teachers have been asked to complete a technology survey. – "What would you recommend for an elementary computer lab? Should students have access to stationary computers or use mobile technology, laptops, tablets, iPods, etc? Should students be allowed to use their SMART phones as a learning tool?"

Bayfield Staff will continue to investigate the use of e-readers and Ipods as instructional tools. Staff will pilot the use of the Kindle to motivate the reluctant reader. Staff will also analyze the use of workbooks and consumables for instruction. (Blackline masters worksheets vs. hands-on learning). Classroom teachers will be integrating more technology into classrooms this year. Currently we are assessing our technology tools (mobile computer labs and classroom computer stations). Members of the Technology Team are Carol Sowl, Karen DePerry, Kathy Noteboom, Allison Nyara, Tammy Curran-Weber, Chris Plansky and Sheila Everhart.

➤ ***Bayfield Elementary 2011-2012 Student/Staff Continuous Growth Plan***

Staff continue to "Focus on Student Learning" Staff are beginning the process of learning about and implementing: Professional Learning Communities, Common Core State Standards, Aligned Curriculum, Universal Instruction, Common Formative and Summative Assessments, Grading for Student Learning. K-5 teachers will have administered Universal Assessments for Reading, Language Arts and Mathematics. Staff are now providing students with interventions and monitoring student's progress.

- The K-12 School Garden Committee is working with the cafeteria and classrooms compositing fresh fruit and vegetable snacks and lunch scraps. The Garden Committee met on Tuesday March 6, 2012. Magdalen Dale and Brittany Schmitt, Americorp Members with the Wisconsin Farm to School Program have created and shared a draft curriculum with K-12 teachers specific to the planting, maintaining and harvesting produce for our area. Our Farm to School Nutrition Program Coordinator Brittany Schmitt will be working with students regarding spring planting of our school garden. **School Climate and Family Involvement:**

***Bayfield Troller After School Program (TAP):***

The Bayfield Troller After School Program (TAP) students' participation averages 84 students per night. The third session of TAP will end on March 15, 2011. The fourth session of the year will be held April 9 – May 10, 2012.

***School Climate Initiatives: The Peaceful School Bus and The Peaceful Playground***

curriculum will be shared with Staff and Students in this Fall. Fifty new sleds have been purchased for K-5 students. Students enjoy sledding during their recess. Student behavior data identified that students do not use conflict resolution skills on the playground or while riding the bus. Therefore staff are teaching and re-teaching conflict

resolution skills. New radios have been installed on all buses. This will allow office staff direction communication with drivers.

**Bayfield Elementary Family Night Schedule** Twenty Family Nights have been scheduled for the 2011-2012 school year. As of December 21, 2011 eight Family Nights have been hosted by staff. We have had a total of 504 people attend. The average participation per event has been 63 people. We are looking forward to April Ojibwe Language Tables and an Ojibwe Language Night May 9, 2012.

**Future Trollers** (2012-2012 **Kindergarten** Parents will be invited to an **Orientation** Dinner on Tuesday April 10, 2012. Kindergarten Families will be invited to an Activity Night Dinner on Tuesday April 17, 2012. The Future Kindergarten Student/ Parent Dinner is planned for May 4, 2012. Projected Kindergarten enrollment for fall 2012 is 24 students.

A joint meeting was held with the Elementary School Administration and the Red Cliff POW WOW Committee on Tuesday March 6, 2012 to plan the **Bayfield School District/Community POW WOW** that will be held on **May 10, 2012**.

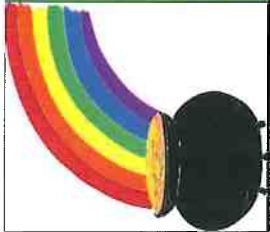
