

INTERPRETATION OF ANSWERS TO TB RISK SCREENING

Yes answer	Interpretation
A only	Symptomatic; should not be working with sick people until evaluated by a healthcare professional.
A and B A and C A and B and C	Person is symptomatic AND has risk factors which increase the risk of TB infection or disease. Should be tested for TB with skin test or IGRA and evaluated by healthcare professional with exam and chest X-ray (CXR).
B only C only B and C	Person has risk factors for TB; should be tested once to assess for TB infection. Treatment should be offered if infection present. After initial test, only needs repeat testing if symptomatic or has known exposure.
D positive previous test only B and D positive previous test C and D positive previous test B and C and D positive previous test	Ask: Were you treated after the positive result? If no, would you like to be treated? Treatment should be offered. Will need medical evaluation including up-to-date (within previous six months) CXR before beginning treatment.
A and D positive previous test	Needs medical evaluation and CXR to assess for active disease.
