#### 2018 Summer School General Information

**MEALS:** Free breakfast and lunch will be served during summer school for district residents 18 years and under.

**DAILY SCHEDULE:** Most classes are offered two weeks each/four days long.

Students are expected to attend the summer school classes in which they are enrolled. Parents should notify the Pupil Services office at (715) 779-3201, ext. 134, if their child will be absent for the day.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP: No students will be allowed in the school building before 7:45 a.m. Please drop off your child and pick up your child at the main entrance. Students will report to the cafeteria prior to all classes.

BUS TRANSPORTATION: Bus transportation is provided for students living on the Red Cliff routes <u>ONLY</u> at predetermined spots. You will be notified prior to the first day of summer school (June 18th) what time your child will be picked up and dropped off.

FIELD TRIP INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES: At times, students will be taking field trips. Field trip permission is assumed when you sign the registration form. If you do NOT want your student participating in field trips, please put your request in writing.
