## 2018 Summer School General Information

**MEALS:** Free breakfast and lunch will be served during summer school for district residents 18 years and under.

**DAILY SCHEDULE:** Most classes are offered two weeks each/four days long.

7:45 a.m.-8:20 a.m. Breakfast available in the cafeteria.

8:20 a.m.-10:00 a.m. First Session

10:00 a.m.-10:15 a.m. break/recess

10:15 a.m.-11:45 a.m. Second Session

11:45 a.m.-12:05 p.m. Lunch served in the cafeteria.

12:15 p.m. Approximate time for bus departure.

Students are expected to attend the summer school classes in which they are enrolled. Parents should notify the Pupil Services office at (715) 779-3201, ext. 134, if their child will be absent for the day.

**DROP OFF AND PICK UP:** No students will be allowed in the school building before 7:45 a.m. Please drop off your child and pick up your child at the main entrance. Students will report to the cafeteria prior to all classes.

**BUS TRANSPORTATION:** Bus transportation is provided for students living on the Red Cliff routes ONLY at predetermined spots. You will be notified prior to the first day of summer school (June 18th) what time your child will be picked up and dropped off.

**FIELD TRIP INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES:** At times, students will be taking field trips. Field trip permission is assumed when you sign the registration form. If you do NOT want your student participating in field trips, please put your request in writing.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL

\_\_\_\_\_ **Academic Recovery & 10% Make-Up: Grades 7-12th, June 18-28**  
*Middle and high school students will have an opportunity to finish their coursework from the school year. Students attend June 18th until their work is completed or June 28, whichever comes first. Instructor: Karen DePerry*

(FULL) **Lake Superior – Lake Baikal Connection: Grades 9-12, July 18 – August 4** *Bayfield High School students will travel to Lake Baikal in Siberia. Lake Superior is the world's largest freshwater lake by surface area, and Lake Baikal is the world's largest freshwater lake by volume. We will hike along the shore of Lake Baikal while learning about the biology and geology of the area. We will also connect with Siberian students who will travel with us. We will learn about the people and the culture of Siberia.*

\_\_\_\_\_ **Learning from the Land: Grades 9-12, June 25-29, 8 am – 4 pm**  
*Learning from the Land is a high school program that focuses on engaging youth in science and the natural world. By learning about their cultural heritage and Indigenous ways of knowing, youth are encouraged to explore STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and environmental careers. Students will engage in science activities in Red Cliff two days and in Bad River two days. This program is open to high school students from Red Cliff/Bayfield and also Bad River/Ashland. Maximum enrollment for this course is 12 students.*

## ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

\_\_\_\_\_ Culture through Cooking: Students entering 3rd-6th grades, June 18-28 (Full Morning Session) *Students will research and explore cultures around the world. Each week we will delve into a student-selected culture and create dishes and meals that are traditional to that specific culture. Students will gain geographical information, will plan and prepare recipes while using concepts of multiplication and measurement, and will also learn basic kitchen safety and cooking skills. Instructors: Ms. Angela Botka and Mrs. Kate LaPointe, with added nutrition education from Stephanie Bakker, UW Extension. Maximum enrollment for this course is 16 students.*

\_\_\_\_\_ Camera Clique: Students entering 3rd-6th grades, June 18-28 (Full Morning Session) *Students will learn photography skills, how to upload and edit photos. Every child is given a digital camera and inspired to go out and photograph the world in a new light. Mr. Iversen is a fun educator and photographer who thoroughly enjoys imparting his extensive photographic knowledge to the younger generation. Instructor: Mr. Eric Iversen*

\_\_\_\_\_ "Rock, Paper, Scissors" Sciences & The Arts: Students entering 2nd-5th Grades, June 18-28 (Half Morning Session) *Students will learn and create while combining the arts and sciences. A mixed bag of science projects will ensue while simultaneously creating art. Instructor: Marilyn Larsen*

\_\_\_\_\_ Reading Beyond the Rainbow: Students entering 2nd-5th Grades, June 18-28 (Half Morning Session) *This fun summer reading class will be filled with Ojibwe culture, reading, and storytelling by our elders. Students will create Ojibwe art and keep journals of their experiences. Instructor: Deb Bouley*

## LAPOINTE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

\_\_\_\_\_ Building Skills, Building Relationships, Building Floats: LaPointe K-5 students, June 18-28 *In this half day summer school course students will participate in a project based learning challenge where they must create a float that represents themselves as a group of students and their community on Madeline Island for the 4th of July parade. Students will collaborate to plan, use new, found and reused materials, and construct a float for all children on the island to be in the parade on the 4th of July. While participating in this summer school class students will be building communication, leadership, and engineering skills and encouraging their creativity. Additionally they will be building on foundational skills and expanding knowledge and problem solving abilities. Instructors: Kaite Sweval and Evan Ralph Maximum enrollment is 15 students.*

## AUGUST SUMMER SCHOOL SESSIONS

\_\_\_\_\_ Kindergarten Readiness: **Students ENTERING Kindergarten**  
Fall 2018 ONLY, one week, August 6-9, 2018, 8 a.m.-Noon (One class over four days.) *Come and enjoy a 1-week fun-filled class!! This class will emphasize rhyme, music, and art. The children will work on small motor skills, thinking skills, listening skills, and social skills. In addition, the children will get to know our kindergarten procedures, make projects inside, and explore the outdoors. This experience will help your child transition to the "big school" and allow your child to have a better start to the kindergarten expectations. Instructors: Beth Dahl and Amanda Westlund*

\_\_\_\_\_ Legos for Learning: Students entering 2nd-5th grades, August 6-9, and August 13-16 (Full Morning Session) *Learn from a hands-on educational tool for reading and math through Lego Education. This class will be designed to teach mathematical problem solving, reading, and will enhance writing abilities. It will provide an engaging and meaningful learning experience for all students. Bonus: develop communication and collaboration skills. Small group reading and tutorials will also be provided to students at their specific ability. Instructors: Trent Hanson and Katie Makolondra.
