HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC DIRECTOR REPORT

1. **Boys Basketball-** Due to injuries the team is now Varsity only.
 - a. 17 boys participating
 - b. Tournament Roster is 9 players.
2. **Girls Basketball** – 19 girls participating
3. **Wrestling-** Regionals started on February 14, 2015
 - a. Regionals were held in Phillips, which James LaPointe, Josiah Cook, and Zach Anglin made it to Sectionals.
 - b. Wrestling Sectionals were held Osseo, WI. One wrestler made it to the State Tournament. According to Head Coach Steve Miller, this is the first time since 1989 we have sent a wrestler to state. EXCITING!
 - c. Zach Anglin made it to the State Tournament in Madison on Thursday, Feb. 25, 2015 (first rounds). And Zach wrestled on Friday, February 27, 2015. Zach finished his season in 6th place overall at the State Tournament. We had the opportunity of having other wrestlers go and experience the State level competition. A very good learning experience for all.
4. **Renewal of the 2 year Coop Contract** with Washburn for Wrestling. (see attached)
