PBIS Meetings:

The PBIS Committee is meeting monthly to review this year's action plan and to coordinate the efforts of staff to accomplish the plans goals. We are reviewing school data to determine the focus areas for staff and students. The committee meets once a month in the library. All staff is invited to attend.

Bayfield Police Department School Visits:

John Fangman, Chief of Police, and his officers have provided weekly walk-throughs in our school building to meet and talk with staff and students. This has given our students and the officers the ability to ask questions with each other and meet on a positive basis. This is an outstanding effort by Mr. Fangman and his staff.

Red Cliff Police Department Interventions:

Bill Mertig, Chief of Police, has provided officers upon request to come to the school building to engage students and teachers in the classroom to speak about anti-bullying and other topics. So far, the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades have had an officer provide information on bullying. The students were engaged and were provided the time to ask questions to the officer. Our next request will be with the middle school and then the high school.....thanks to Mr. Mertig.

Discipline Referral Process:

Middle School referrals are similar to the previous year. The major behavioral occurrences are in the classroom. Teachers are continuing to work with students on their classroom rules and expectations. We continue to do our best to contact parents/guardians regarding the referral process and work to build relationships with the students.

High School referrals are similar to the previous year. The major behavioral occurrences are happening "out of bounds" or in the hallway transition areas. As a result, the staff has made the attempt to focus on the procedures for students to enter and exit classrooms. So far, we have seen progress with students and have had less major referrals in this area.
