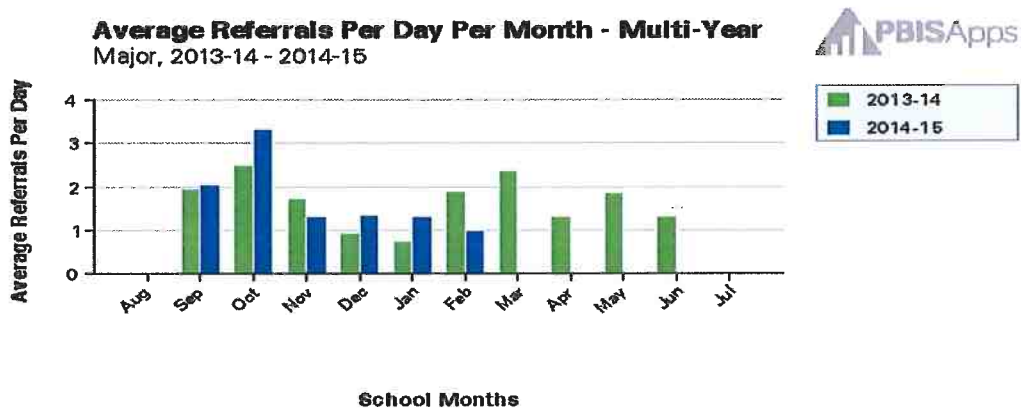
PBIS Committee Meetings: The PBIS Tier 1 school wide team held a meeting on February 10th, to review the annual action plan. The committee revised the plan with additions and deletions for this year. Teacher classrooms are a priority for the coaches. We are asking staff to identify their classroom needs in regards to PBIS materials and wall posters.

PBIS Tier 2 school wide team met on February 24th, with the focus on starting the check-in and check-out program at all three building levels. The team along with staff has identified students who are in need of the program. Mentors have been assigned to begin working with students the first week in March.

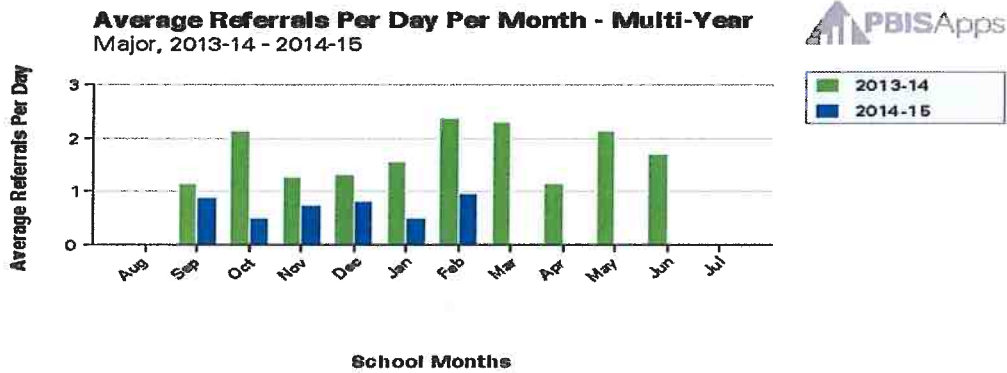

PBIS Referrals: Multi-year numbers below.

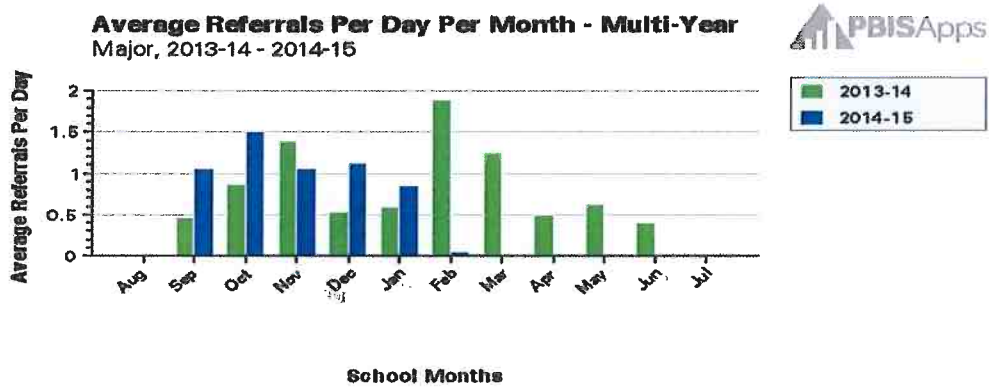
High School total Major referrals – 2013-2014 (199) vs. 2014-2015 (201)
