Academic Achievement:

Ms. Paap, Mr. Erickson, and Mr. Kinney's classes spent a night at the International Wolf Center in Ely, MN. as a wrap up unit studying wolves on November 20th.

Cathy Smith has been awarded a Personal Finance Grant due in part to all the hard work she is putting into the Business Ed. program.

Supportive Climate:

Veteran's Day Program was held on November 11th. Red Cliff VFW and Bayfield Coast Guard members were both active in the ceremony, with U.S. Navy (Retired) Boatswains Mate Senior Chief David Curran as our Master of Ceremony.

Effective Communication:

Use of Data & Resources:

School Report Cards were released to the public. High school report card increased in overall score significantly. High school was at Meets Expectations. Middle school score dropped to Meets Few Expectations.

Attendance:

Successful Parent/Teacher conferences were held. Middle School had an overall 59% family attendance. High School has 57% overall family attendance. We now have a base number to work on improving future attendance.

Middle and high school staff have been internally covering for one another for meetings, during substitute shortages, and other emergency situations. It is appreciated and has helped keep our substitute costs lower.
