Academic Achievement:

Lesson plans for Middle School this week is at 88%, compared to five weeks ago when they were only at 44%. High school lesson plans are at 74%, compared to 32% five weeks ago submitted. Middle school and high school Forward Exam dates have been set for April. The specific testing details are being drafted now. Middle school teachers have begun testing prep and training today, March 9th. The ACT assessment occurred March 3rd, with a protein rich breakfast served up to the Juniors before testing began. Juniors were the only students in attendance in order to provide a quiet, calm testing environment.

Supportive Climate:

Two staff members have been selected as 2020 Kohl Teacher Fellows. Congratulations to Karen DePerry and Anne Sullivan. They will be recognized at a luncheon in Eau Claire in April.

Effective Communication:

The 2020-2021 schedule has been a work in progress. A scheduling team (D. Livingston, A. Sullivan, J. Gordon, and S. Swanson) met for an all day retreat to develop a seven period day. Classes and periods will be based on student needs, creating a schedule driven by those needs.

Use of Data & Resources:

A team of teachers will be attending the Wisconsin Indian Education Association conference on April 16-18, 2020. A substitute teacher recruitment and training day was held with the district adding four additional subs to our roster. There are currently three student teachers working with staff mentors for field hours; two students are from Northland College and one student is from St. Scholastica.

Guest speakers in the last three weeks included Jamie Nabozny (topic: Bullying), Star Nayea (topic: Healthy Relationships), and Bill Miller (topic: Heritage, Art, & Music, with a core focus on reconciliation).
