Academic Achievement

The high school ACT has been completed by our 11th grade students for the 2021-22 school year. The upcoming Forward exams for grades 3-8 and grade 10 will be completed during the testing window from March 21, 2022 through April 29, 2022. The ACT Aspire exams for our 9th and 10th graders will be scheduled soon.

Our Science curriculum team is wrapping up their meetings for the school year and have made or are still working on making their decisions on curriculum that they would like to move forward or continue with for the next six years. I will be presenting our K-5 teachers science curriculum recommendation at this month's school board meeting.

Our middle school science teacher, Mr. Kinney has decided to continue teaching the McGraw-Hill iScience series. I have ordered some "replacement" hardcover textbooks for this science series, and have renewed the digital subscriptions for the 2021-23 school year. The digital subscriptions will then have to be purchased each year, as they cannot be purchased years ahead of time.

The high school science teachers are still looking at materials and will make a decision by April, 2022 as to what they want to purchase. They are currently looking to possibly purchase some new hardcover books, science lab equipment, etc. for the next six years.

Supportive Climate

We had our monthly RtI/PBIS team meeting on Wednesday, March 16th. The RtI School-wide Implementation Review survey and the Tiered Fidelity Inventory (PBIS) have been completed at all grade levels and the RtI/PBIS team will use the data from these surveys to develop their RtI/PBIS Action plan at their monthly meeting in May, 2022 for the 2022-23 school year.

The MAP reading and math universal screener will be purchased after July 1, 2022 (next year's budget) for all school grade levels K-12. This universal screener will replace the STAR universal screener. I will be working with our representative from NWEA and with Chris Plansky to get MAP set up for our district, and am currently in the process of setting up a two-hour MAP training session for each grade level K-5, 6-8 and 9-12 during our district's August 2022 inservice.

Effective Communication

As RtI/PBIS Coordinator, I have scheduled upcoming monthly meetings for our RtI/PBIS team. Weekly "Strive Time" booster lessons continue to be shared with staff by our PBIS coaches at each grade level at the beginning of each week. Weekly "Strive for Five" awards continue to be given out to students on Fridays and three staff members receive a monthly PBIS recognition award by being nominated by their colleagues.

As our district's DAC (District Assessment Coordinator), I held a training session for all of our test administrators/proctors for the Wisconsin Forward exam during our last inservice. Grades 3-5 teachers have been asked to set up their own Forward exam testing schedules and I am currently working on a middle school and 10th grade schedule. I will be working diligently to get the testing tickets cut out and placed in their respective envelopes during the next few weeks in preparation for the Forward exam for our students. The Forward testing window opens on March 21, 2022 and will close on April 29, 2022.

Use of Data & Resources

Since our WISEdash training on Thursday, February 10th, presented by Amanda Popovich from CESA 12, I have been working with our K-12 staff to make sure that they have the access to all the data in WISEdash that they need for their classrooms and/or school level.
