### Student Success:

Summer work includes

- Hiring teaching staff.
- PLC work:
  - Attend the Professional Learning Communities at Work Institute in Minneapolis. Becky Brown 3rd grade, Sarah Potter 5th grade, and myself will be representing ES. This small team will lead the efforts in the ES to become a true PLC school.
  - Read- Make It Happen: Coaching With the 4 Critical Questions of PLCs at Work by Kim Bailey and Chris Jakicic
  - Review- Taking Action: A Handbook for RTI at Work by Austin Buffum, Mike Mattos, and Janet Malone
  - Rereading (3rd time) Transforming School Culture by Anthony Muhammad.
- Reviewing data in WISEdash Local to look for trends in math and ELA to prepare for the 22-23 SY.
- Review data from the Forward Exam for grades 3-5 to look for trends in math and ELA (grades 3-5) and science and social studies (grade 4) to prepare for the 22-23 SY. Hard copies should be delivered on 7-21-21.
