From mid August to present I offer the following summary;

- · Attended several meetings with Red Cliff's Tribal Historic Preservation Office staff
  - RC language camp recap and reflection
    - 285 participants completed surveys
    - discussion of language goals for the camp by age
    - discussion of *power standards* that the SDB can align with the Tribe's efforts to increase Ojibwemowin recognition and use.
    - discussion of when RC Language Trainees will be in SDB to work with the district's language and culture teachers

      - Brian Boyd: High School
- Attended weekly meeting organizing Treaty Day commemoration, Sept. 30 on Madeline Island
  - Day of events slated
  - SDB's Island School will be the location for a lunch (provided by the Bayfield Food Service team)
  - SDB's Island School will be the location for a meeting with Governor Evers as well as a discussion on Treaty language and their role today.

  - The district would still be able to send out PCR tests if they are deemed necessary.

  - established Summer School 2023 sessions

    - Second Session: July 31-3, August 7-10
  - Other programming that occurred;

    - Red Cliff Language Camp
    - Wolf Camp
    - Island Rec Program
    - Red Cliff Pow Wow
    - Rec Center swim lessons
    - Red Cliff's Archaeological Field School
  - Continue with from scratch breakfasts (made by a small group of summer staff)
  - Discussion of the need for an increase in summer school teacher classroom budgets.

- currently summer school teachers get \$50 for classroom supplies.
- Discussion to have Dean of Instruction, Colleen Beagan serve as the Admin. to sign off on teacher blue sheets, rather than Amy.
- State Superintendent, Dr Jill Underly joined us for the first day of school!
  - assembly for Middle and High School as well as 4th and 5th grade
- WNBA Megan Gustafson joined us for the first day of school
  - assembly for Middle and High School as well as 4th and 5th grade
- Meeting with National Park Service (principals, Ed/Agric. Coordinator, Alt. Ed teachers)
  - collaboration K-12
    - suggestion by Rick Erickson to create yearly "investigations" of the natural/cultural world by grade level
    - SDB Administration will create a comprehensive list of what grades currently do as will the NPS share what programming currently exists.
    - Next meeting will be late September/early October
- Multiple meetings and extensive email correspondence regarding the incident during a girls volleyball game at Mercer
  - a Mercer student making sounds that many felt were racially offensive
  - Phone conversations with Mercer Superintendent, Renae McMurry
    - organizing a meeting with Mercer and BHS students to discuss the incident and how to move forward.
      - Date, September 27 at CESA 12 in Ashland
        - CESA 12 has volunteered to have one of their staff (Amanda Trautt) serve as a facilitator, if both districts agree.
  - Meeting with Nick Madison, CESA 12 to discuss the need for action pertaining to good sportsmanship.
    - Nick suggested a Sportsmanship Summit at CESA 12 in early November for students and staff.
- Met with Carol Fahrenkrog, Bayfield Chamber of Commerce
  - Apple Fest logistics and partnerships
  - SDB to host an After Hours event in December at our mainland schools building.
- Met with Boys and Girls Club employee, Dusty LaFernier
  - Dusty will be in the mainland schools several times a week to engage with interested students during their free time to learn drumming and dance.
  - He is also available for other engagements, such as tutoring, social emotional support and cultural connections.
- Manoomin/ricing season and SDB
  - We had a very successful ricing season in partnership with the Red Cliff Tribe and Bayfield County Extension as well as other community volunteers.
    - processing of rice harvested will begin at the end of September
  - Teachers are encouraged to continue to incorporate manoomin into their lessons each fall.
- Attended the monthly WASDA (Wisconsin Association of School District Administrators) meeting
  - over 100 districts have new Superintendents this year
  - discussion of NEOLA policies and the importance of contextualizing them to fit our district—make them "yours"
  - reminder of regional WASDA meetings this fall
  - State Superintendent budget release soon
