- September 27 Meeting at CESA 12 w/ Mercer students & Bayfield students
 - discussion of racial incident at away game @ Mercer (monkey calls)
 - CESA 12 Administrator, Nick Madison facilitated
 - students discussed why the calls were offensive and discussed solutions
 - students agreed to read aloud the WIAA Sportsmanship Conduct Code at the beginning of each game
 - requested that the Indianhead Conference name be changed
 - Nick shared there will be a Sportsmanship Summit at CESA 12, Wednesday, Nov. 9th for students and staff from all CESA 12 schools to learn and share information about respect, conduct, and changes needed in and around sports.
- New Spirit Pole erected in front of the mainland schools on Sept. 28
 - in partnership with the Red Cliff THPO Office and the MS and HS Bayfield Alt. Ed classes.
 - The Ojibwe spirit pole is a symbol of how we work together to learn and grow, and are connected to the past, present and future.
 - It is replaced every year and marks a new beginning
- Covid Clinic Inc. updates;
 - plans to begin assisting with testing, Monday, October 17
 - 15 hours a week including travel time from Mercer-the other school they are working with.
 - 3 mornings a week at SDB
 - Monday, Wednesday and Thursday
 - The district would still be able to send out PCR tests if they are deemed necessary.

 - a new group of parents, guardians, caregivers of our SDB students
 - over 20 parents in attendance
 - Next meeting, Thursday, October 13th at the mainland school library
- Attended the Sept. 30 Treaty of 1854 Recognition Day on Madeline Island
 - MS and HS students attended from the mainland
 - ES students attended from SDB's Island School
 - Many Ojibwe Tribal leaders in attendance
 - Wisconsin Governor, Tony Evers attended

- lots of learning!
- Attended the Red Cliff Junior Tribal Council meeting, Sunday, Oct. 2
 - The main point of discussion was the Mercer/racial incident and what the JR TC would like to do in response.
- Oct. 5 attended a joint meeting between Bad River's Education Department and Red Cliff's THPO office on the
 - Ojibwemowin trainees, progress made and next steps
 - 6 of the 8 trainees are interested in pursuing immersion teaching licensure
 - trainees will be ready for classroom teaching by 2026
 - The next steps are to meet with other districts who have started language immersion classrooms in their districts and what their stories are.
 - first meeting of this kind is Monday, October 17th w/ Edye Washington from Duluth public schools
 - Question: Does the School District of Bayfield, the district families want an Ojibwemowin immersion learning option?
 - the 2022-23 Title VI/JOM Annual Assessment results show the number 1 cultural/educational activity is Ojibwe language
 - This has been the number one request of families surveyed for YEARS.
 - Lots of cognitive development research has been done on the merits of language immersion and student assessments.
- Monthly meeting with Jacob Kaiser of the RFR/Rec Center
 - discussed swim lesson logistics for elementary classes
 - TAP programming needs
 - Summer programming for 2023
 - joint statement to the public if the Rec Center changes ownership (board directed) saying both the District and RFR will continue to support the wellness of our students and communities.
- Continue to work with the Administration team on district strategic priorities and goals. scheduling meetings to continue work with Kevin Stranberg in order to fully articulate specific benchmarks around the following priority drivers:
 - Student Success: attendance and MAP assessments
 - Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing: BEST screener, staff surveys
 - Community Collaborations & Partnerships: Family and community engagement
 - District Excellence: State report card and balanced dashboard of other priorities
 - Efficient Use of Resources: balanced budget and open enrollment
