

Student Success:

We have completed the administration of our new universal screener called the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) from the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) and our elementary teachers participated in a 3 hour training with a NWEA rep on 10-10-22 to learn how to utilize the data from this screener to support student growth. Teachers were shown many resources that they can use at the school level, grade level, classroom level, and individual student level to help guide their planning and instruction. The reports that are available from NWEA are a great way for teachers to see what areas (general) and learning targets (specific) each of their students can work on as well as seeing areas of our curriculum and instruction that need improvement. Teachers used much of this data to help drive the creation of their Student Learning Objectives/Professional Practice Goals (SLO/PPG) which is part of their evaluation through the Educator Effectiveness (EE) process. The ES teacher staff will now start moving forward in creating school goals based on this data. The MAP test will be given again in the winter and spring so we can track growth over time, eventually being able to track growth from year to year. Since this is the first MAP test our students have completed, we will use this data as our baseline in creating our goals for this year and determining our growth over the next few years.


School Achievement: Math K-12

LaPointe Elementary


School Achievement: Math K-12




