School-Based Mental Health Grant Strategic Priority - Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing

- February 22, 2023, Stephanie Lewis, Muskadee Montano, Nicole Gurnoe, Karla Vinci met to review details of the grant, which is in its final months. The balance at this time is approximately \$24,000.
- The staff had a number of excellent suggestions and requests. In an effort to honor the staff requests and move toward addressing potential future changes, monies will be allocated to cover the cost of mental health navigator time and to support a book study. Over 40 staff members will be reading and discussing *Intentional Neuroplasticity: Moving our Nervous Systems and Educational system Toward Post-Traumatic Growth* by Dr. Lori L. Desautels.

• Opening for a special education teacher of Intellectual Disabilities continues to be posted for the 2023-2024 school year. Currently have two applicants and plan to schedule interviews in the beginning of April.

Special Education - *Strategic Priority - Student Success & District Excellence*

- Bayfield School District is scheduled to participate in the Indicator 8-Family Engagement Survey. January 18th, IEPs were locked so DPI could roster our students on the 20th, with the survey window open from mid-January through June 30, 2023.
- "The Indicator 8 Family Engagement Survey is one of Wisconsin's <u>State Performance Plan (SPP) improvement indicators</u>.
 Indicator 8 identifies the *percent of parents with a child receiving special education services who report that schools*

facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities. In

Wisconsin, Indicator 8 is a cyclical indicator measured by a family engagement survey that local education agencies (e.g. school districts) must send once every five years to every parent in their district whose child is receiving special education services ages 3 through 17."

• As of 3/20/23, 109 IEP/evaluation meetings have been held since the start of the school year. Thirty-two initial special education referrals that have been received. The district currently has 115 students with IEPs.
