School District of Bayfield Board Report Stephanie Lewis, Director of Special Education/Pupil Services January 10, 2023

Pupil Services Teams - *Strategic Priority - Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing*

- The elementary pupil services team is meeting every other week and is currently discussing interventions for eight students of concern.
- The middle & high school pupil services team is meeting every other week and is currently discussing interventions for fourteen students of concern.

School-Based Mental Health Grant

- January 9, 2023, the teen Mental Health First Aid instruction began in 10th grade health class, taught by Tracy Henegar, Senior Outreach Specialist Human Development & Relationships Educator, Bayfield & Douglas Counties. Muskadee Montano and Joel Barta will complete training in order to continue teaching this unit in future health classes.

Human Resources - *Strategic Priority - District Excellence*

- Opening for a special education teacher of Intellectual Disabilities continues to be posted for the 2023-2024 school year.

Special Education - *Strategic Priority - Student Success & District Excellence*

- Bayfield School District is scheduled to participate in the Indicator 8-Family Engagement Survey. DPI will start the rostering process on the 20th, with the survey window open from mid-January through June 30, 2023.
- " The Indicator 8 Family Engagement Survey is one of Wisconsin's [State Performance Plan \(SPP\) improvement indicators](#). Indicator 8 identifies the **percent of parents with a child receiving special education services who report that schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities**. In Wisconsin, Indicator 8 is a cyclical indicator measured by a family engagement survey that local education agencies (e.g. school districts) must send once every five years to every parent in their district whose child is receiving special education services ages 3 through 17."
- While the Indicator 11 - Timely Special Ed. Evaluation was completed earlier this year, additional information and reporting was requested and completed, which included contacting five families.
- Five staff members - paraprofessionals, regular and special education teachers - have registered for the second class of a three course Autism Spectrum Disorder certification.

- As of 1/10/23, 62 IEP/evaluation meetings have been held since the start of the school year. Twenty-four initial special education referrals that have been received. The district currently has 106 students with IEPs.
