## **Dean of Curriculum and Instruction Monthly Report**

Date: July 6, 2023

The Collaborative Classroom PD plan has been finalized. Teachers in grades 3-5 will complete the Being a Reader training during August Inservice. SIPPS (Systematic Instruction in Phonological Awareness, Phonics, and Sight Words) training for grades K-5 will also be during August Inservice. The dates are confirmed with Collaborative Classroom.
I will be meeting with Amanda Trautt on July 24<sup>th</sup> to look over our eMLSS system and start looking at what we need to change and improve. This is just the start of what will be a continuing process this next school year.

• Stephanie and I have created a team that will participate in the *Comprehensive School Mental Health Academy 2023-2024*. It is a yearlong workshop that will help promote a positive school climate, social-emotional learning, mental health, and well-being.

• An email was sent to a group of teachers to invite them to *Untying the Knot of Trauma: You are the Intervention*. The conference is on August 16 & 17. I have heard back from three staff members who are interested.

• The state-required CTE data has been entered into Infinite Campus.

• Our ACP/Career Readiness plan was submitted to CESA 12. The presentation will be at the July meeting.

• Xello will be back next year in grades 6-12. I have completed a draft schedule for the school year. Karla, Laurelei Moore from WEOP/Gear-Up, and I will be facilitating most of the lessons. Teachers will be responsible for facilitating some as well, but I will be there to support them. Karla and I will be attending a Xello training to learn more, we want this to be a successful initiative.

• The 2023-2024 assessment schedule is started, but still a draft. I am still mulling over some of the dates<sup>®</sup> Once it is complete, I will share it with the Board.

• Act 30 was passed in 2021 and requires Holocaust and other genocide studies to be taught in Grades 5-12. I will be attending a 3-day virtual conference July 18-20 to educate myself on expectations and listen to some amazing speakers. I did send invitations to teachers in grades 5-12. I have taught a course on the Holocaust, but look forward to learning more.

• On Friday, July 7<sup>th</sup> I am attending a cultural event on Madeline Island sponsored by Red Cliff and Bad River. I am really excited about this opportunity.

• July projects are New Teacher Mentoring Handbook, getting monthly meetings on the calendar for PBIS/RtI team, mentoring team, and curriculum scope and sequence meetings.
