Dean of Curriculum and Instruction Monthly Report

Date: December 12, 2023

Forward testing will start the week after Spring Break in Grades 3-8 and 10th. On December 24th practice exams will be available and shared with teachers. There are changes to the ELA test this year. To learn more about the ELA changes <u>Click Here</u>.
Bayfield 4th and 8th grade students will be taking the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) on February 28-29. As a district, we are responsible for helping to plan and schedule the assessment, but NAEP sends staff to test our students. They will bring all supplies including computers for testing. In January I will set a meeting with our NAEP representative to finalize all details of the test.

• The DLM student reports for all current students have been printed and added to their cumulative files. This had not been done in years past, and going forward the DAC will need to print, file, and send home a copy of the overall report to parents. A letter to parents and a document on how to interpret the report will also need to be sent home.

• The ACT test will be on March 12th and the PreACT on March 20-21. The ACT will be conducted online and in small groups in high school classrooms. Stacy Peterson, Micaela Hall, and I will facilitate the PreACT in the library. The students in SPED who have accommodations will test with Laura Comer and Ali Erickson.

• Nick DePerry and I continue to work on developing his instructional skills. We are also working on classroom management strategies. Nick is very knowledgeable and is working hard on creating engaging lessons.

• I have met with McGraw Hill and SAVVAS about new Social Studies curriculum. The district curriculum timeline has Social Studies slated to be purchased in 2024. In the next few weeks, we will receive samples for teachers to review and use in their classrooms.

• Laurelei and I completed our second Xello lesson with students in grades 6-8. We started with an activity that helped students understand how to manage their time. The students also shared how they currently manage all the tasks they need to complete daily. We have had a lot of positive engagement with Xello and look forward to our February lesson.

• As you all know ACT 20 (Wisconsin Reads) was passed this past Spring. This Act will require changes in curriculum and instructional practices, with a focus on 4K-3. I have been staying on top of the updates and wanted to share the links I check from the DPI.
