## Follow up from February board meeting:

The door #4 stairwell/entrance (high traffic due to access to the playground for elementary classes).
 One solution to cold air coming into the building is to keep the doors closed at the bottom of the stairs (by current kindergarten rooms) and at the top of the stairs (by current first grade/second grade rooms). A question regarding safety and camera placement if doors are closed was asked by the board.
 Chris Plansky's answer:

"We have one camera at the bottom of the stairwell, near the kindergarten rooms. That one will be unaffected. There is another camera at the top of the stairs by the first grade rooms. Having the door closed will block that view. An additional camera will take additional wiring, the purchase of a new camera, and ongoing licensing for that camera."

          - shared what it is like to have children in an immersion program.
    - 5 District staff have expressed interest in joining an immersion programming workgroup along with administrators.

    - Board Workshop with Administration focused on language immersion , Wednesday, March
