New to the 25/26 School Year, all district staff are required to complete a 40 minute Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI) Training that focuses on verbal de-escalation and proactive support for students. In previous years, only the Student Services Team was required to enroll in CPI training. Members of the SST will continue to be certified in the full CPI framework. More information about the newly implemented De-Escalation Course for all staff can be found HERE.

The Student Services Team (SST) will meet at the elementary, middle, and high school levels respectively during the 25/26 School Year. The "leveled" meetings will be held at minimum twice a month. District staff are able to refer students to the SST using the form linked HERE. Student attendance trends and data will be discussed at each meeting. A parent/caregiver form is in process. The District SST meeting meets once a month to determine K-12 approaches and supports. SST Roster is available HERE.

The Sensory Room Training will be held on Friday September 12th for all elementary and related services staff. Angie Schoeppach (Occupational Therapist) is leading the design and plans for the room. Once all items have been received and set up an opening announcement and schedule will be distributed.
