#### Student Success:

Twelve seniors will be presented with the ACT 20+ recognition cords for graduation. A breakdown of previous years is: 2026 twelve students, 2025 seven students, 2024 two students, and 2023 three students.

Seniors who have participated in GEAR UP or Talent Search with the Department of Public Instruction will also be receiving recognition cords to wear at the graduation ceremony.

Student representative(s) have attended the last two board meetings. Students involved shared that the experience has been positive and super information. I will continue to invite students for board attendees to include student voices when needed.

#### Student & Staff Health and Wellbeing:

End of year activities have been in the works for many grades. Annual Kick-ball tourney is planned; hats to be ordered. Four different sixth grade trips are planned, including; trip to the aquarium in Duluth, Stockton Island day trip, kayak trip with Trek & Trail, and sailing half day event. Most are funded by BCEF grant money.

A week-long team building activity was held for MS/HS staff and students. It culminated in receiving "wishes" from staff & students. One teacher's wish for a field trip to the aquarium and a student's wish for a donation to the [Trevor Project](#) were granted.

#### Community Collaborations and Partnerships:

Middle School held its annual Career Week. Speakers were invited from our community. They included a kayak guide/owner, yoga & meditation instructor, a boat captain, a potter, sailors & outdoor educators, a memory care coordinator & poet, and an entertainment coordinator. Shadow Day was also a part of this week's career recognition. 100% of the middle school students were able to shadow someone.

Science-Fest was a huge success. Chi miigwech to Ms. Marshall for all of her event planning. Many high school students volunteered at the event. Student displays were provided by our third grade students this year.

May Term planning is underway. HS May Term coordinator has worked diligently to organize the student choices, student groups, and transportation. Coverage for shared staff is planned to ensure MS and ES instruction continues in the HS teacher(s) absences.

Junior Prom is planned. Our juniors and their advisors have worked closely with a local business, St. James Social, to plan a prom to be held at a new location.

Our senior class will be featured in the Daily Press's graduating class spotlight. Information has been sent to their editor for inclusion in this special edition.

Our Carl Perkins grant will be used to help a student train with our Computer Tech. assistant to become certified in [COMP-TIA](#).

**Other:**

Interview committees held interviews for HS & MS Science, as well as 6-12 Spanish and Tech. Ed. All four candidates have accepted the positions.
