BOARD DUTIES AND POWERS

The Board of Education has four major functions: to set goals and priorities for the District, policy-making, fiduciary and evaluation. In performing its policy-making function, the Board shall determine what should be done. It will establish guidelines for the accomplishment, delegate authority for the implementation, and provide the financial means for the achievement of such objectives.

The Board shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to the business management of the district including, but not limited to, purchasing, financing, insurance, budget development, and cash management.

The Board's evaluation function is the study of facts and conditions to determine such items as:

- a. efficiency and operation of the school system;
- b. review, update and/or revision of district policies and procedures;
- c. effectiveness of the educational program and activities in relation to the District's educational philosophy, goals and priorities.

The Board shall represent and act for the State in providing the District with the kind of educational programs and facilities required or permitted by law. Board duties and powers include those expressly granted by statute, implied by statutes expressly granted, and those essential to the accomplishment of the purposes for which the School District of Bayfield was created.
